Efficiency Vermont's PMO was established in late 2018. Although still in its infancy, the PMO office has quickly become an important and valuable resource for effectively managing organizational projects. The PMO has a staff of four, three of which have achieved their PMP certification, and reports to the Director, Efficiency Vermont Operations.

Information Request

Efficiency Vermont is seeking project management services for organizational projects when PMO resources are at or over capacity. A commitment to applying project management best practices and standards is required, including project initiation, planning, execution, monitoring and closure. Types of projects consist of enterprise level projects, marketing and technical projects.

Efficiency Vermont is interested in securing consulting services to assess the current PMO framework, governance standards, tools and to provide recommendations to increase value and results. The scope includes the review of project management processes, standards and templates to identify focused areas of improvement. In addition, consultant(s) will review current practices to track, manage and monitor organizational resources and propose development opportunities.

Consultant(s) gain an understanding of organization operations to provide a customized approach to achieve the PMO's objectives. Efficiency Vermont seeks partners to collaboratively develop prioritized solutions, while understanding and incorporating our culture and operating practices.
